Springtime showers may bring ... flooding

Information for today's drivers & home owners

Most Canadians look forward to the first signs of the season but as spring showers pour, you may be at risk for property flooding.

The following tips can help keep your property above water and save you thousands of dollars in damages:

- Inspect your roof every few years to check the condition of the shingles and avoid leaks. You should also clear out your eaves troughs every year to prevent blockages.
- Install a backwater valve which will close automatically if the sewer backs-up.
- Check your foundation. If you notice water pooling as the ice melts or after heavy rains, find a way to lead it away from your home.
- Finish your basement right by sealing the exterior walls.
- Run your sump pump if your basement has one. Examine and test it to ensure it works when you need it.
- Review your insurance policy. While overland flooding is generally not covered, you can often add additional coverage, including protection from sewage backup.

Your car's spring tune-up checklist

Take the time to ensure your car is ready for warmer weather by:

- Checking your tires. Use all season tires and maintain your tire pressure as both will improve your vehicle's fuel economy.
- Replacing your windshield wipers.
 These may be cracked or torn from ice, snow, salt and extreme temperatures.
- Cooling your car. Ask your mechanic to check your coolant levels at the start of the season.
- Fighting salt damage. Replacing your salt-clogged air filter in the spring gets you more kilometres per litre.
- Checking the air conditioning. Test your system to ensure it produces or preserves temperatures of 10°C below the outside air.
